FROM THE RECTORY

February Reflection

February is a month of contrasts. The year is still young, winter lingers, and yet our attention is already drawn toward two significant moments in the Christian calendar and in everyday life. We begin the journey of Lent, a season of reflection and repentance, while also encountering Valentine's Day, a celebration of love, affection, and relationship. Held together, these moments invite us to pause and consider not just what we believe, but how we live and love.

Lent begins quietly, but honestly. It calls us to slow down and to look inward. As ashes mark our foreheads and familiar words remind us of our human frailty, we are invited to lay aside pretense and self-sufficiency. Lent is not about proving our devotion or measuring our goodness. Rather, it is a season that gently draws us back to humility—to an honest awareness of our need for God.

This humility is at the heart of Jesus' teaching, especially in his parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector. One approaches God confident in his own righteousness, rehearsing his achievements. The other comes with nothing to offer except honesty and a plea for mercy. Jesus makes it clear that it is the humble heart, not the impressive record, that God receives.

Lent invites us into that same posture. It encourages us to ask difficult but necessary questions: What am I relying on? Where have pride or comparison crept into my faith? What needs to be surrendered so that God can renew me? Through prayer, fasting, and acts of generosity, Lent creates space for God to work within us.

Jesus captures the heart of this season in a single sentence:

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (Matthew 6:21)

Lent helps us notice where our treasure truly lies—not just in words, but in habits, priorities, and attitudes. It calls us to realign our hearts with God's purposes and to rediscover what truly matters.

Alongside this reflective season sits Valentine's Day, with its focus on love. In our culture, this love is often portrayed as romantic, effortless, and fleeting. While it can be a joyful celebration, it can also feel exclusive or superficial. The Christian understanding of love, however, is deeper and more demanding. It is rooted in humility, faithfulness, and self-giving.

Seen through the lens of Lent, Valentine's Day becomes an opportunity to reflect on the kind of love we are called to live out—not just in romance, but in friendship, family, church, and community. True love grows where there is humility, patience, forgiveness, and grace. It is shaped not by self-interest, but by a willingness to place others before ourselves.

As February unfolds, Lent and Valentine's Day together remind us that the Christian life is a journey of the heart. A heart that learns to pray honestly. A heart that is willing to repent and be renewed. A heart that loves not only in words, but in truth and action. May this month be a time of gentle returning—to God, to humility, and to a love that reflects Christ's own. And may we walk the Lenten path with open hearts, trusting that God meets us not in our perfection, but in our willingness to be transformed.

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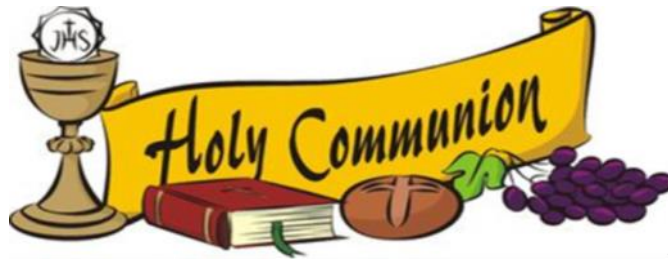
